I, the above named deponent do hereby solemnly affirm and  
declare as under:-

1. That in compliance of the order dated 27.09.2017 passed by this  
Hon'ble Court, the requisite information has been sought from the  
concerned authorities and the same is given hereinafter for the  
kind perusal of this Hon'ble Court.

2. That so far as the monitoring, supervision or surveillance of the movements at two Dera headquarters between 25.08.2017 till 08.09.2017, namely, before the sanitization process under the supervision of Court Commissioner is concerned, the Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa vide his letter dated 03.11.2017, has submitted a detailed report giving therein, the topography, background, Force Deployment/Check points, sequence of events, recoveries made during patrolling and has concluded as under:-

“The possibility of movement of moveable assets/documents/articles from Dera before 25<sup>th</sup> August or during the road journey of Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh from Sirsa to Panchkula on 25<sup>th</sup> August cannot be ruled out, as a fleet of close to 350-400 vehicles (inadvertently written as 200 vehicles in the report of Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa were part of this road journey from Sirsa.

1. After the pronouncement of the verdict, the priority of district administration was to maintain law and order at any cost considering the volatility of district Sirsa. A tight cordon could be placed around the Dera only after clearing out of followers from the Dera due to reasons specified in the aforesaid sequence of events. The dera is encapsulated by open and vast agricultural fields and there is a possibility of movement of followers from the Dera premises and

residents of colonies near the Dera. Followers were also evacuated by the aid of buses at the behest of the district administration from 27<sup>th</sup> August evening after thorough check of body and baggage.

2. The law and order situation in the district was extremely volatile till 28<sup>th</sup> August i.e. the date of pronouncement of sentence. The checkpoints around the dera were increased and a tighter cordon around the Dera was in place from 28<sup>th</sup> August evening. The check points established near and around the Dera were, to an extent, successful in nabbing persons and objectionable articles in their possession as listed out in the preceding paras. In view of this scenario, the possibility of movement of assets/documents/articles from the Dera premises or from the adjacent colonies, comprising largely of dera followers, cannot be ruled out due to pre-occupation of forces in maintaining law and order. The sequence of events discussed above in detail make it amply clear why it could not be prevented.

3. It is reiterated that 2 main roads lead to Rajasthan to the south of the dera on Sirsa-Bhadra main road. Checkpoints were in place since 22<sup>nd</sup> August on these 2 main roads at Nathusari Chopta and Jamal to keep a check on the

movements. However, there are a large number of roads, including village roads, which lead to Rajasthan from the Dera. As the number inside the Dera thinned out and additional force was made available to Sirsa, a tighter cordon was placed all around perimeter of the Dera by increasing the number of check points around the dera.”

A copy of the report of Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa dated 03.11.2017, is annexed as **Annexure R-1** for kind perusal of this Hon'ble Court. It is respectfully submitted that the maps mentioned in the above mentioned report would be produced before this Hon'ble Court during the course of hearing.

3. That, with regard to creating/notifying new 'revenue estate' and 'abadi deh' of village Shah Satnampura, the Additional Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, Revenue Disaster Management Department vide his U.O. dated 03.11.2017, has intimated that a proposal was received from Deputy Commissioner Sirsa vide letter dated 14.08.2015 for excluding the village Satnampura from Village Shahpur Begu and to establish an estate. The total land of both villages was 56458 Kanal (7057 Acres). Out of the same, the land of village Shahpur Begu was measuring 42994 Kanals 2 Marla (5374 Acres, 5 Kanal & 02 Marla) and the land of village Satnaampura was measuring 13463 Kanals 18 Marla (1682 Acres, 7 kanal 18 marla). The total population of

village Shah Satnaampura was 2767 and there were 423 houses. Keeping in view the report of Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil), Sirsa, a proposal was made to establish village Shah Satnaampura, Tehsil and District Sirsa as revenue estate with Hadbast No. 338 by separating it from village Shahpur Begu. As per Government instructions dated 16.11.1984, for giving Hadbast No. to any village, the population should have 500, land should be measuring 1000 Acres and there should be 100 houses. The village Shah Satnaampura was fulfilling all the requisite conditions. As per section 110 of Punjab Land Revenue Act read with para 124 of Punjab Settlement Manual, the Additional Chief Secretary and Financial Commissioner to Government, Haryana is competent to declare any village as revenue estate by giving Hadbast number. However in this case, after taking approval from the competent authority as per Rules of Business of State and getting the draft of notification vetted from Legal Remembrancer, Haryana, the notification dated 14.11.2015 was issued by the Additional Chief Secretary and Financial Commissioner to Government, Haryana, Revenue and Disaster Management Department.

4. That, with regard to the missing persons, a status report has been received from the Additional Director General of Police, Crime, Haryana. As per the report, two SITs have been constituted vide for investigation of cases/complaints of missing persons from Dera

Sacha Sauda-Sirsa. As per order issued by Superintendent of Police, Sirsa, 22 persons are reported to be missing from Dera Sacha Sauda-Sirsa in which necessary FIRs/DDR's have been registered. The cases/complaints have been investigated by both the SITs. As per the detailed status report, 5 persons have been traced out. 1 person returned home and he has expired on 27.05.2015 at his house. The other cases are under investigation. The copy of the status report is annexed as **Annexure R-2**.

5. That, regarding constitution of Tribunal to determine the genuineness of such claims and to quantify the losses which the claimants may be entitled to, the respondent State wants to crave the indulgence of this Hon'ble Court to the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court on the similar issue, in case *WRIT PETITION (Crl.) NO. 77 OF 2007 In Re: Destruction of Public & Private Properties Versus State of A.P. and Ors.* The relevant part of the said directions is reproduced as under:-

“In the absence of legislation the following guidelines are to be adopted to assess damages:

- (i) Wherever a mass destruction to property takes place due to protests or thereof, the High Court may issue suo motu action and set up a machinery to investigate the damage caused and to award compensation related thereto.

- (II) Where there is more than one state involved, such action may be taken by the Supreme Court.
- (III) In each case, **the High Court or Supreme Court, as the case may be, appoint a sitting or retired High Court judge or a sitting or retired District judge as a Claims Commissioner to estimate the damages and investigate liability.**
- (IV) An Assessor may be appointed to assist the Claims Commissioner.
- (V) The Claims Commissioner and the Assessor may seek instructions from the High Court or Supreme Court as the case may be, to summon the existing video or other recordings from private and public sources to pinpoint the damage and establish nexus with the perpetrators of the damage.
- (VI) The principles of absolute liability shall apply once the nexus with the event that precipitated the damage is established.
- (VII) The liability will be borne by the actual perpetrators of the crime as well as organisers of the event giving rise to the liability - to be shared, as finally determined by the High Court or Supreme Court as the case may be.



(VIII) Exemplary damages may be awarded to an extent not greater than twice the amount of the damages liable to be paid.

(IX) Damages shall be assessed for:

(a) damages to public property;

(b) damages to private property;

(c) damages causing injury or death to a person or persons;

(d) Cost of the actions by the authorities and police to take preventive and other actions

(X) **The Claims Commissioner will make a report to the High Court or Supreme Court which will determine the liability after hearing the parties.**

The recommendations of Justice K.T. Thomas Committee and Mr. F.S. Nariman Committees above which have the approval of this Court shall immediately become operative. They shall be operative as guidelines."

The State Government has appointed Mr. Justice K.C. Puri (Retired Judge of High Court) as Claim Commissioner to assess the damage caused to public/private properties and to investigate the liabilities in respect of the incidents during reservation agitation in the Year-2010 and Year-2016.

However, in view of the above directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the respondent State is of the view that this Hon'ble Court may, if deem fit, kindly be pleased to appoint a sitting or retired High Court judge or a sitting or retired District judge as a Claims Commissioner or as a head of Tribunal as the case may be, to estimate the damages and investigate liability including to determine the genuineness of claims and to quantify the losses which the claimants may be entitled to.

6. That, with regard to the Institutions including hospital, colleges, schools which are located at the Dera premises, it is submitted that as per report of Director General, Health Services, the Hospital located in the Dera is functional, at present.

Further, on the basis of the report of the District Education Officer, Sirsa, the Direction, Secondary Education, Haryana has intimated that the schools located at Dera premises were inspected by him (the District Education Officer, Sirsa) on 30.10.2017. During the inspection, all the schools situated in the premises of Dera Sacha Sauda have been found functional. Presently, the schools are being managed by the Principals concerned and salary of the staff is partly paid by them out of fees collected from the students. The students of the Dera schools have returned back to schools.

The present status of the schools is as under:-

7. That, the State Government is of the view that patients in the hospital and the students and staff in the above said schools and colleges should not be suffered without any fault on their parts

and these institutions should be allowed to be run by their respective managements. However, the Hon'ble Court, if deem fit, may appoint an Administrator for overall supervision.

8. That, while seeking the reports from concerned offices vide letter dated 10.10.2017, the respondent State issued necessary instructions to the Deputy Commissioners to provide the requisite information and assistance to the learned Court Commissioner including all the facilities as were directed vide order dated 05.09.2017 by this Hon'ble Court. A copy of the letter dated 10.10.2017 is annexed as **Annexure R-4**.

Kindly refer to your letter No. 4/24/2017-2HC dated 10.10.2017, on the above noted subject. The reply to Para No. 5 of your above referred letter as per directions issued on 27.09.2017 by the Hon'ble High Court in the above said CWP and that, Also, **Superintendent of Police Sirsa** has reported that there is a need to briefly capitulate the topography of the Dera, historical background of clashes involving Dera followers, force deployment and sequence of events during the time period specified in the order. So the reply is explained as under:-

**Topography :**

Dera Sacha Sauda, Sirsa, comprising of old and new Dera premises, is situated on the main Sirsa-Bhadra road. The old Dera is located about 2 kms from Shah Satnam Singh Chowk of Sirsa town and new one is about 5 kms from the old Dera. There are double / triple storey built up structures on both sides of the 7 kms stretch of road with an inhabitation

of approx. 20000 people who are by & large followers of the Dera. The new Dera is approximately 25 kms from the Rajasthan border at Kagdana on this road leading to Bhadra (Hanumangarh district, Rajasthan). At the culmination of the boundary of the new Dera on the main Sirsa -Bhadra Road, a road extends eastwards, passing through village Bajekan and joins Sirsa-Hisar highway i.e. N.H.9. This stretch is roughly 9 kms and encompasses the areas of Nezia and Bajekan villages and is the road popularly referred to as that on the backside of the Dera. The entire topography of the area near and around the Dera is evident from the map attached at M-1. The old Dera (map attached at M-2) is spread over approx. 30 acres and consists predominantly of built up structures. The new Dera (map attached at M-3) constructed in 1993 is spread over approx. 800 acres of land consisting of built up structures in around 150 acres of land and agricultural open fields in the rest of the area. It is pertinent to mention that district Sirsa has been the headquarters of DSS since its inception and its followers are living in large numbers in villages and towns of Sirsa. The district has 4 Dera including the Dera headquarters and 15 Namcharcha ghars.

**Background:**

The past instances of law and order confrontation involving the Dera followers have occurred in almost all sub divisions/major towns of the district apart from Sirsa City. In 2007, clashes broke out in Ghukanwali (Odhan) and later on spread to other parts of the district. In

2008, a Sikh was murdered in Dabwali which subsequently led to violent clashes between Sikhs and Dera followers. In 2012, clashes and subsequent violence took place at Sirsa and later on spread to Rania and Ellenabad. In Sirsa, as per past instances, the followers start collecting in large numbers along the road from the aforesaid Shah Satnam Singh Chowk to Dera on Sirsa-Bhadra road and march aggressively through the city bazars and attempt to vandalise Gurudwaras located in center of the city. They also have attacked public properties in the past and tend to march to judicial/administrative complex. Nevertheless, owing to this issue, the district has been communally sensitive with a surcharged atmosphere. Accordingly, there was a huge possibility of the threat of violence breaking out simultaneously in all parts of the district after any violent confrontation with law enforcement machinery or any opponent group.

**Force Deployment/Check points :**

As on 25<sup>th</sup> August, 2017, 10 CAPF (central armed paramilitary forces) companies were allotted and deployed in the district in addition to the district police force and force from HAP/other units of state police. Of the 10 CAPF companies (approximately 750 men deployable in all) - 5 companies were deployed at sensitive locations outside the city area including Dabwali (around 60 kms from district HQ), Kalanwali, Odhan and Rania/Ellenabad. The balance force including Haryana Police Force was deployed at strategic points in company strength formations to seal

off the city. The ingress into the city from Dera was cut-off by a strong barricading near Jagdamba Paper Mill by using concrete blocks and concertina wire. The heavy anti-riot equipment including Vajra vehicle and water cannon was deployed at this point. One company of RAF was also deployed here. The threat of flanking action by any potential mob was covered by deployments to the eastern and western ends of the barrier. Ingress into city from Bajekan side was likewise blocked by deployment at the T-point where the link road links the dera to Sirsa-Hisar National highway-9. A company was deployed to protect the court complex and residential complex of judges as this could be a potential target. Begu power house and Vita Milk Plant were located between the old and new Deras inside the areas populated densely by Dera followers. A platoon each was deployed to protect these establishments as more force was not available. A list of CAPF companies with their reporting/deployment dates and their places of deployment is attached at Annexure-1. Deployment of Army, on the request of Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa, was in place from 25<sup>th</sup> August evening after instances of police firing on Sirsa-Begu road. The deployment status of Army columns is attached at Annexure-2. The availability of state police and their deployment details are attached at Annexure-3.

A total of 29 check points (enlisted in Annexure-4 ) were in place in the entire district. A map of District Sirsa with plotting of these check points is attached at M-4. It is worthwhile to mention here that Sirsa



adjoins Hanumangarh district of Rajasthan and Malout, Bhatinda and Mansa districts of Punjab in addition to bordering Fatehabad district. These checkpoints were in place since 22<sup>nd</sup> August to keep a check on the movement of people inside the district. There were 5 check points on Rajasthan border and 8 on bordering Punjab. Other check points were in place at strategic points in Sirsa city and subdivisions of the district. In addition to these 29 checkpoints, 4 checkpoints were put up near and around the Dera on 25<sup>th</sup> August. As the law and order situation restored to normalcy and with additional availability of force, the checkpoints were increased to 11 on 28<sup>th</sup> August evening and later to 15 on 1<sup>st</sup> September leading to a tighter cordon around the Dera. A list of date-wise checkpoints near and around the Dera is listed at Annexure-5 and a map to this effect is attached at M-5. It is pertinent to mention here that 2 main roads lead to Rajasthan to the south of the Dera on Sirsa-Bhadra main road. Checkpoints were in place since 22<sup>nd</sup> August on these 2 main roads at Nathusari Chopta and Jamal to keep a check on the movements. However, there are a large number of roads, including village roads, which lead to Rajasthan from the Dera. The map at M-6 is indicative of the possible multiple routes to Rajasthan from the Dera.

**Sequence of events and Response:**

On 24<sup>th</sup> August, 2017, around 200 Dera followers started gathering at HUDA Chowk near Judicial Complex, Sirsa. The numbers swelled up to around 1500 as the day progressed. They were not allowed to progress

ahead of the Chowk towards judicial complex by barricading with concertina wires. The atmosphere was surcharged and there was an element of uncertainty over the court appearance of Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh which prevailed till early morning of 25<sup>th</sup> August. Curfew was imposed in Sirsa on the night of 24/8/17 under Section 144 CrPC to isolate the movements of any potential mischief makers and prevent collateral damage to innocent civilians. Estimated 40000-50000 followers including women and children and elderly people were reported to be massed inside the new Dera as per local intelligence and CID reports. Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh travelled by road from Sirsa to Panchkula on 25<sup>th</sup> August and a fleet of close to 200 vehicles accompanied him on the day of the verdict.

After the pronouncement of the verdict, the priority of district administration was to prevent incidents of arson and rioting by the followers of Dera who were massed inside the old and new dera premises and the residential colonies and villages along the Shah Satnam Singh Chowk -Begu - Dera road. Inputs started pouring in about dera followers gathering at Bajekan railway station and Kanganpur. The police control room also received calls regarding an assembly of large number of followers on Begu road and in Namcharcha Ghar of Ellenabad. Media personnel belonging to PTC and Aaj tak present on the main road outside the new Dera to capture live feeds of the reaction of followers were attacked and their vehicles damaged. Meanwhile, a mob of 10000-12000

assembled at Sach petrol pump at around 3 pm near New Dera on Begu road and marched towards Sirsa city causing arson and violence enroute at Vita Milk Plant and 132 KV substation at Shahpur Begu. The police forces deployed at both these locations were outnumbered and attacked. 7 vehicles were set ablaze at Begu substation and one carbine with a magazine was snatched. A total of 53 vehicles were set on arson at Vita milk plant. Police had to resort to firing at both these locations owing to the intense commitment of the mobsters to damage public properties but that did not deter the mob from marching towards the city. The march was halted at the Jagdamba Paper Mill Barrier but not before destruction of a boundary wall of the paper mill and attempting to set the mill on arson. The police/paramilitary forces and civil administration battled with the mob for 3 hours in which tear gas shells, rubber bullets, plastic pellets were used to disperse the mob intended on committing arson in the city. The duty magistrate authorized police firing after all other attempts to disperse the mob had failed. The situation was brought under control with great difficulty. 6 persons in all died in police firing at three locations. The police party had to also fire tear gas shells to disperse an unlawful assembly at Auto market, Kanganpur road, Sirsa at around 5 pm. Further strategy was discussed and it was decided that any attempt to push south of this stationed point was fraught with risk as it would expose the forces to attacks from rooftops. Army columns were deployed at Shah Satnam Singh Chowk, Jagdamba paper mill barrier and

Bajekan Chowk at around 9 pm the same day. The atmosphere was emotionally surcharged after the verdict and police firing at Sirsa. News of casualties in police firing at Panchkula had also come in and the risk of a widespread flare up all over the district was considered as a serious threat.

On 26/08/2017, Army columns alongwith duty magistrate and police/paramilitary forces advanced 500 meters south and stationed near Old Dera. Around 30000 followers as per intelligence reports were still massed inside the new Dera. There was also a risk of a stampede being triggered inside the Dera if any attempt was made to move towards the Dera with thousands assembled inside. It was decided to encourage egress of followers from within the Dera and to strategically hold the forces onto existing positions till situation calmed down. The power supply to the Dera had got disrupted after the arson at Begu powerhouse and the same was not restored to build pressure on dera followers to leave the Dera. Meanwhile, there were reports from various corners about assembly of followers from various villages in Deras/Namcharcha ghars of the district on Sunday i.e 27<sup>th</sup> August as is the usual practice to assemble every Sunday. The reports indicated that they may try to engage in violence and disrupt law and order. Additional 7 CAPF companies were allotted and they were deployed in various parts of the district to ensure that there was no breakdown of law and order.

The situation on Begu road was so hostile even on 27/08/2017 that a media personnel of news18 who ventured out to get across the old Dera was attacked and his vehicle snatched by miscreants on a motorcycle. Intelligence reports also indicated that the followers were restrained from coming out of the Dera by certain persons from within the new Dera. Contact was also established by the civil administration with the Dera management to mount pressure for clearing out the followers. In the evening on the same day, the followers were taken out in buses arranged by the administration and were subjected to interrogation and body and baggage search before they boarded the buses at Nejia bridge, south of the new Dera on the main Sirsa-Bhadra road . There were intelligence reports of around 15000-20000 followers still present in the dera. The sentence had to be pronounced on 28<sup>th</sup> August and it was again decided to ensure that there is no incident of rioting or violence in the district after the pronouncement of sentence. The additionally allotted CAPF companies, as listed in Annexure-1, were deployed to adopt a zero tolerance approach in ensuring peace in the district.

On 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2017, Army columns alongwith duty magistrate and police/paramilitary forces advanced nearly 5 kms down south and stationed at Sach petrol pump, 200 meters from the new dera premises. The number of checkpoints around the dera were increased and thus, a tighter cordon was placed all around perimeter of the dera from 28<sup>th</sup>

August evening till the completion of sanitization process on 10<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 under the supervision of the Court Commissioner. The dera management was also strictly directed to deposit any weapons inside the dera and as a result, 23 weapons of 17 license holders bearing the address of Dera were deposited. The achievements of checkpoints and the patrolling parties near and around the Dera during the period include:

1. One Revolver, 5 cartridges, One pistol, five cartridges 32 bore were recovered from Sukhdarshan S/o VedParkash R/o Gali No. 1 Civil Station Bathina and Kamaljeet Singh S/o Dharshan Singh R/o Gali No. 6 Harbans Nagar Bathinda at Bajekan checkpoint and case FIR No. 148 dt. 26.08.17 u/s 188 IPC and 27/54/59 Arms Act PS Sadar Sirsa was registered the same day.
2. One 12 Bore Gun and 13 cartridges were recovered from Naib Singh S/o Nikka Singh R/o Tejoke near Bajekan T Point and case FIR No. 149 dt. 27.08.17 u/s 188 IPC and 27/54/59 Arms Act PS Sadar Sirsa was registered the same day.
3. One A.K.47 Rifle with 50 cartridges, One pistol 9 mm with 30 cartridges, one Motorcycle with R.C. were recovered from Rohit Kumar S/o Jamohan R/o Parjapat Colony, Bathinda near T. Point Bajekan and case FIR No. 150 dt. 27.08.17 u/s 188 IPC and 27/54/59 Arms Act PS Sadar Sirsa was registered the same day.

4. One A.K.47 Rifle with 50 cartridges, One pistol 9.mm with 30 cartridges, one motorcycle were recovered from Satbir Singh S/o Ram GopalKamboj R/o H.No. 48 Gali No. 2 North Avenue Vasu Road, Patiala near railway crossing, Bajekan and case FIR No. 151 dt. 27.08.17 u/s 188 IPC and 27/54/59 Arms Act PS Sadar Sirsa was registered the same day.
5. One bag containing one laptop, 10 Hard Discs., 92 Pen drives, two memory card, 32 CDs, 21 video cassttes,7 Audio Cassettes etc . was recovered in village Nejia on 28.08.17 from the house of Shri Chand S/o Hukma Ram Caste Jat R/o ward No. 5 Phephana PS Nohar now village NeziaKhera. This bag was kept in his house by Balraj Singh S/o Harchand Caste Jat R/o Lalpura Distt. Hanumangarh, who has been arrested in case FIR #695 dated 25.08.2017 u/s 124A, 147,148,149,307,188,435 IPC, 25/54/59 Arms Act, PS City Sirsa, on 27.08.2017, as per investigation.
6. One drone was recovered on 03.09.17 in the area of NejiaKhera, near T Point Begu Road from Raj Kumar @ Raju S/o Bali Ram Caste Arora R/o Gali No. 1 KalyanNagar,Sirsa.
7. One Motor cycle bullet modified was recovered on 02.09.17 from Gursweak @ Happy S/o Ramesh Chander Caste Kamboj R/o Chamalnow Gali No. 4 Kalyan Nagar, Sirsa

The Hon'ble High Court, in its order dated 29<sup>th</sup> August, had directed the Government to intimate plans of sanitization of Dera Sacha

Sauda, Sirsa. The matter was discussed at length and the risks involved and operational requirements were intimated to the higher ups in written and telephonically. A view was taken by the Government to get the search and sanitization of the Dera conducted under judicial supervision. The vast area of search - the new Dera being a virtual township with residential colonies, resorts, theatres, hospital, schools, colleges and factories- was divided into sectors and a detailed deployment plan was worked out with meticulous attention to detail. The Hon'ble High Court appointed a Court Commissioner for supervising the search. A detailed briefing was given to Ld. Court Commissioner on his arrival at Sirsa in presence of all field commanders and sector incharges and the search and sanitization plan was finalized in light of his observations and directions. The search was started the very next day at the break of dawn without any delay.

The Government had deployed Sh. V. Umashankar a senior IAS officer posted in Gurugram and Sh. Amitabh Dhillon IPS IGP Hisar Range to camp at Sirsa for guiding the District Administration. All decisions regarding strategy and deployment were jointly taken by S.P. Sirsa and the Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa on daily basis and as per situation at hand in active consultation with the aforesaid senior officers and all decisions were taken with unanimity of opinion. The higher authorities and Government were kept apprised of all developments and decisions through telephone and official letters.



In view of the specific comments sought in the aforementioned order of Hon'ble High court and in the light of facts stated above, the undersigned makes the following submissions:-

The possibility of movement of moveable assets/documents/articles from Dera before 25<sup>th</sup> August or during the road journey of Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh from Sirsa to Panchkula on 25<sup>th</sup> August cannot be ruled out, as a fleet of close to 200 vehicles were part of this road journey from Sirsa.

1. After the pronouncement of the verdict, the priority of district administration was to maintain law and order at any cost considering the volatility of district Sirsa. A tight cordon could be placed around the Dera only after clearing out of followers from the Dera due to reasons specified in the aforesaid sequence of events. The dera is encapsulated by open and vast agricultural fields and there is a possibility of movement of followers from the Dera premises and residents of colonies near the Dera. Followers were also evacuated by the aid of buses at the behest of the district administration from 27<sup>th</sup> August evening after thorough check of body and baggage.
2. The law and order situation in the district was extremely volatile till 28<sup>th</sup> August i.e. the date of pronouncement of sentence. The checkpoints around the dera were increased and a tighter cordon around the Dera was in place from 28<sup>th</sup> August evening. The check

points established near and around the Dera were, to an extent, successful in nabbing persons and objectionable articles in their possession as listed out in the preceding paras. In view of this scenario, the possibility of movement of assets/documents/articles from the Dera premises or from the adjacent colonies, comprising largely of dera followers, cannot be ruled out due to pre-occupation of forces in maintaining law and order. The sequence of events discussed above in detail make it amply clear why it could not be prevented.

3. It is reiterated that 2 main roads lead to Rajasthan to the south of the dera on Sirsa-Bhadra main road. Checkpoints were in place since 22<sup>nd</sup> August on these 2 main roads at Nathusari Chopta and Jamal to keep a check on the movements. However, there are a large number of roads, including village roads, which lead to Rajasthan from the Dera. As the number inside the Dera thinned out and additional force was made available to Sirsa, a tighter cordon was placed all around perimeter of the Dera by increasing the number of check points around the dera.

As desired, with all details stated above, the information is being sent to you, alongwith enclosures, for further necessary action, please.

2. It is intimated that in the aforesaid case, the Hon'ble High Court is seized of the incidents of violence erupted due to conviction of Gurmeet Ram Rahim by CBI Court, Panchkula and the Hon'ble Court vide orders dated 27.09.2017 (copy enclosed) has issued certain directions.

The action taken report is to be filed in the aforesaid case.

3. The Additional Chief Secretary to Govt., Haryana, Revenue and Disaster Management, Department and Town & Country Planning department are requested to get the matter examined and submit comment/view/justification within 10 days positively regarding the

alleged undue favour given to Dera Sacha Sauda in the matter of granting CLU exemption from sanctioning of building plans and other statutory permissions which have been granted under the device of creating/notifying new 'Revenue Estate' and 'Abadi Deh' as reported in 'The Print' published on 20.09.2017 headline as 'Haryana Government's gift to Ram Rahim's Dera:- Free regularization of unauthorized properties' (copy enclosed).

4. The Director General of Police, Haryana is requested to get the matter examined regarding the alleged 25 persons missing from Dera Head Quarter and that the SIT constituted by State Government to supervise and monitor the FIRs registered regarding missing persons and to file status report regarding investigation.

5. The Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa is requested to submit a fact finding report, after due verification regarding monitoring, supervision or surveillance of the movements at two Dera Head Quarters between 25.08.2017 till 08.09.2017, namely before sanitization process under the supervision of Court Commissioner commenced, as to whether moveable assets/documents/articles of any type were allowed to be removed from the Dera premises during this period and whether, the residents of Deras were permitted to move out freely during those days, specifically pointing out whether the exit doors of Deras towards Rajasthan were kept open during those days, if so whether any security check was deployed to supervise the movement from that gates?

6. The Additional Chief Secretaries to Government, Haryana, School Education, Higher Education, Medical Education departments and Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa are requested to submit a status report as to whether institutions including hospital, colleges, schools which are located at Dera premises are functional or presently closed down? It shall be further explained whether the students from school and colleges operating in Dera have returned, and if so, whether the Administration is willing to run these institutions, as a short-term measure, through Administrator(s) to be appointed by this Court.

7. *The Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa shall ensure that all facilities in terms of order dated 05.09.2017 are provided to the Court Commissioner. All the Deputy Commissioners are requested to extend full co-operation and all types of assistance to the Court Commissioner in respect of determining the issues of the Deras for which exemption has been claimed.*

8. You are requested to provide the requisite status/action taken reports within 10 days positively so that response on behalf of State may be prepared and filed in the court well in time, as the case is fixed for 08.11.2017.
